Witnessing letting go of a hurtful past and giving your life and worries to God because you are accepted by a group of students who are on the Colorado Trip with you has shown me what life is all about. Teenagers...truly, from the bottom of my heart...THANK YOU for showing me what it means to be real, to be genuine, to be passionate, to be forgiving, to... well... show me the power of Jesus and the ministry that you all do every single day. You have inspired me to continue on to where I feel God is leading me...to a new Journey in my life.

And to everyone who has ever supported these incredible teens and the youth ministry in some way in the past 7 years, I thank you for encouraging me, helping me, and supporting me in my life in more ways than you know. You have truly allowed me to leave this place touched and inspired to go out and serve the world in the way that I feel God calling me to do so. The ministry that is present and abundant at Our Savior's Lutheran Church will continue to go with me on this new Journey of life. My journey has been enhanced by YOU...the community of Our Savior's Lutheran Church, and I hope yours has too. **What's a blog?**

No matter who you are, what your age, or what your job status is, you’ve likely at least HEARD of a blog. The term has become quite common, but if you don’t know what a blog is, you’re likely intimidated and possibly confused. First, **Blog** is short for **Web Log**. In more general terms, a blog is a website, where people write things on an ongoing basis. New stuff typically shows up at the top so visitors can read the most current information first. Visitors can also comment on what’s written and/or share it by sending an email to others. The purpose of a blog is to share information and also create a virtual place to exchange information on a related topic. A typical blog combines text, images, and links to other blogs, Web pages, and other media related to its topic. There are blogs on absolutely ANYTHING you can imagine, literally.

- If you collect some unique trinket, someone likely has a blog about where to find these or sell them.
- If you have a certain health conditions, you can probably find a blog on it, people sharing how they handle it, dietary restrictions, medications etc.
- People who are choose to eat certain types of diets can find blogs with collections of recipes (vegetarian, low carb, etc.)
- If you are going to run a marathon for the first time, you can find blogs on training tips, plans etc.

**Why would you want to visit a blog?**

You can visit a blog to search for specific things, maybe a certain recipe. Each time you go to a blog, you can see the most recent entries or search for specific items. If you want to see the most recent entries, you need to keep visiting the website.

**Why would you subscribe to a Blog?**

People typically ‘follow’ blogs for topics that are of interest to them. For example, I have started a blog for parents on how to help keep kids safe with technology [www.safetech4kids.com](http://www.safetech4kids.com) . People that would like to get an email each time there is a new entry can “subscribe” to the blog.

**How to find a Blog?**

You can search for any topic/subject + blog. For example:



There are also many sites where people can create free blogs like [www.blogger.com](http://www.blogger.com) or [www.wordpress.com](http://www.wordpress.com), along with MANY others. You can also search for blogs on these sites.

This is a VERY basic introduction to blogs. But, hopefully this answers some questions on blogs and possibly encourages you to seek out a blog where you might find information on something that will be useful to you.

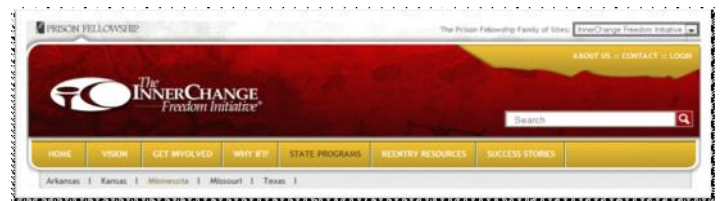

The following is an excerpt from a Thank You letter sent from Thomas Pratt, President of Prison Fellowship:



*“Thank you for your recent gift to IFI!”*

*Your generosity helps serve prisoners like Don. The last time Don left prison, no one met him at the gate but the same old friends who had gotten him into trouble in the first place. But this time, his whole family was there plus his mentor, Nick, from Prison Fellowship’s IFI program.*

*Nick’s first job was to pick up the “Freedom Baskets” from two churches. One basket included toiletries, towels, slacks, a button-up shirt, and dress shoes for Don’s first job interview. From a second church came jeans, white t-shirts, and a pair of steel-toed boots. This church agreed to buy proper work clothing for each IFI member released from prison.*

*When told he had IFI mentors and two churches supporting him, Don’s eyes filled with tears. “The IFI program has helped me so much,” he says. He and his wife pray that their son, who is also in prison, will join the IFI program and give up his old, destructive lifestyle.*

*Our mission to provide Christ-centered service and a message of hope to those in need is deeply rooted in the thousands of loyal and dedicated partners like you. When you support IFI through your gifts and prayers, you help prepare prisoners like Don, for reentry to society, employment, religious and community service, and family and social relationships.*

## Synod Assembly Report: Becoming a Multicultural Church

It was our privilege to join Pastor Steve as delegates, and Maxine Enfield, who was and has been for years a faithful synod volunteer worker, at this year's Synod Assembly held May 26th and 27th at Prince of Peace, in Burnsville.

The theme for this year's assembly in music and in word was "One great anthem blending" which captured the topic of BECOMING A MULTICULTURAL CHURCH. In his sermon at the opening worship service, our Bishop Peter Rogness commented that when the ELCA was formed 23 years ago, one of the goals was to increase the percentage of minorities as members of the ELCA from 2% to 10% in 10 years. Twenty three years later we are at 3% and at the same time the growth of minorities in the general population has grown so fast that it won't be long until whites will be in the minority. He went on to say, "**The world of today isn't the world of our birth; it is new. The church of our children is not the church of our parents. God is inviting us to imagine a new thing.**"

With this introduction, we had three sessions during the two day assembly titled, *Conversations on Race*, led by Herbert Perkins and Margery Otto, co-directors of the Anti-racism Study-Dialogue Circles. Each session challenged our thinking to become more intentional as congregations in our efforts to make multi-cultural persons in our community feel welcome and encouraging them to be participating members of our churches as brothers and sisters in Christ.

Thank you for the opportunity and responsibility to represent Our Savior's at this very well-presented and well-attended synod assembly. It has sparked our appreciation for all that our St. Paul Area Synod accomplishes for our Lord's work in mission and evangelism with limited resources.

Our Savior's is allowed 6 delegates for our size congregation. We will be encouraging 6 for 2012, including 1 or 2 board members, to attend this enriching opportunity. Again, thank you.

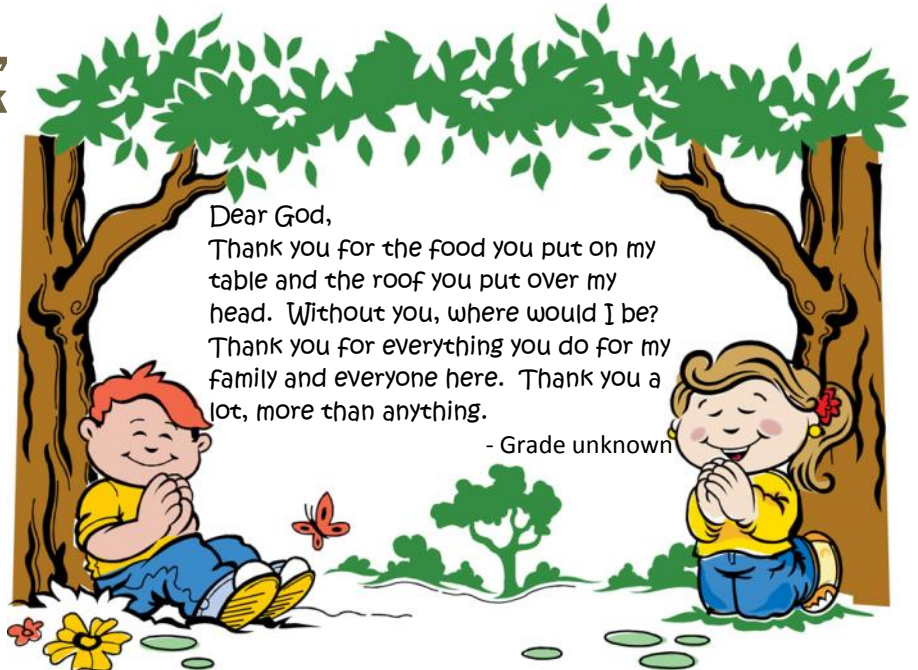
